

Part 5: Action Plan

Introduction

Over the last months and following a review of our School Improvement Plan's Effectiveness Committee Report, The Action Plan Committee has developed a set of strategies addressing target goals for maximizing student learning. These goals serve as priorities for our overall school improvement plan: Improving or Maintaining Standards of Learning End-of-Course test scores to meet or exceed state mandated benchmarks; Improving the Remedial Education Program; Creating a Transition Program for incoming Freshmen; Improving School/Community relations; and instituting new programs to increase student's ability to succeed. The plan addresses the need to continue policies and procedures consistent with effective learning. It also includes a focus on the staff development and in-service programs needed to implement these plans and align our student's needs more closely with the high expectations we have for them. Additionally, these plans identify the components necessary to involve parents and parent organizations. This plan has been designed to strengthen identified areas as a result of the Effectiveness Committee Report.

The action plan was reviewed and approved by the Action Plan Committee. It was then presented to the school's Building Leadership Team for approval before submission to the Pulaski County School Board.

The eleven goals are identified on the following pages. For each goal, the plan lists performance indicators and target performances, operational strategies, responsible personnel, specific resources required and a timeline for completion of the goal. The evidence of evaluation indicators listed is to be used to evaluate the goals as well as the overall effectiveness of the action plan.
